








#### FLORIDA POPULATION GROWTH

#### FLORIDA'S FASTEST GROWING COUNTIES













#### DAILY VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED (MILLIONS)



# **NEVI Formula Program**

New Federal program enacted with **Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)** 

\$198 million to Florida over 5 years (\$29 million in FY22)

Each State must develop an Electric Vehicle (EV) Infrastructure Deployment Plan



# **NEVI Funding Eligible Activities**

Purchase & Install EV Charging Infrastructure

Operating assistance (up to 5 years)

Developmental activities

Signage

Data sharing costs

Mapping and analysis





Florida must submit its Plan by Summer


